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   like to report that on Monday and Tuesday of this
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   week, Board Staff oversaw a two-day test period in
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   preparation for the opening of the Category 4 Mini
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   Casino at Parx Casino Shippensburg. This casino
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   facility will be the 17th land-based casino in the
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   Commonwealth and it consists of 73,000 square feet of
   gaming space with 500 slot machines, 48 electronic
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   table game terminals and a retail Sportsbook.
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                   Director, Chris Schroder of our Bureau
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   of Casino Compliance has led our team in the
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preparation for this opening. The observations made during the two test dates by our staff, and following discussions being held today, the Board will issue - well, the Board will ensure that all aspects of the casino opening will meet operational requirements pursuant to the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development and Gaming Act.

On another note, since this is the January meeting, I tend to like to talk about the performance of the casino industry during the previous calendar year, and it's usually a very good story and this year is certainly no exception.

Our Office of Communications issued two press releases last week that summarized the gaming performance of the land-based casinos, along with those gambling initiatives that were adopted by the legislature via Act 42 of 2017, the online gaming operations, the Sports Wagering Operations, the VGT Truck Stop Operators and the Fantasy Sports Contest Operators. And those two press releases consisted of one summarizing the month of December 2022, and the other for the full calendar year.

With respect to the month of December 2022, it was an exceptional month, ending with over 472 million dollars in total gaming revenue from all

sources regulated by the Board. This was the largest revenue production for a single month to date.

With respect to the full Calendar Year of 2022, the total gaming revenue from all sources exceeded 5.2 billion dollars. That 5.2 billion dollars can be broken down into two main categories. First the land-based casinos contributed 65 percent of the 5.2. billion dollars. And secondly, both online gaming operations, and the VGT's, and the fantasy sports contest and sports wagering, they contributed 35 percent of the 5.2 billion dollars.

On the land-based side, the revenue for Calendar Year 2022 was over five percent better than the previous calendar year or 2021. And on the gambling expansion initiatives, the gaming revenue in Calendar Year 2022 was a little over 20 percent higher than Calendar Year 2021, so both categories did improve year over year with a little bit higher percentage for the online gambling activities.

As we begin 2023, there are indications that the land-based casinos may be successful at keeping their gaming operations moving forward to reach their goals of generating even higher levels of both gaming and non-gaming revenue. Two particular factors that - that I looked at were

that a number of casinos have completed construction on new hotels or additions to existing hotels and some have commenced the constriction phase for a new hotel. Hotels have a very positive impact on casino operations. And as you can leverage, your - your hotel - you can leverage their gaming activity by rewarding your better players with free overnight stays, as well as just generate the public at-large to come and visit your hotel. Usually it brings with it additional food and beverage outlets and it's a very positive development.

Also, as we've seen in other previous years, the casinos review their Gaming Floor continually to ensure that they have the best possible gaming product to offer to the public in their casino. And the manufacturers of slot machines certainly come up with newer and better slot machines almost every year. New games, new twists and turns. And those individuals who enjoy gambling, and there certainly are a lot out there, really do like new products.

And the same thing is true with table game manufacturers. We have seen a number of our casinos in Pennsylvania bring in a new emphasis to electronic table game units and then develop them

with better technology and it will be interesting to see how well they do in the upcoming year.

To conclude my remarks, I would like to recognize the accomplishments of the Pennsylvania gaming industry and in particular their leadership teams. They have certainly been very successful in Calendar Year 2022. The industry and the leadership teams engage in efforts every day to ensure that they are meeting the highest levels of customer service for the gaming public. There's nothing more important than having excellent customer service in an industry like the casino industry.

That, along with the installation of the newest slot machines and the newest table game products have contributed significantly to the continued success of Pennsylvania gaming and it appears to be optimistic as we move forward in 2023. Thank you very much, Chair.

Smyler and Board Members. Today I'd like to provide

an update on Board expenses accrued the first half of

Fiscal Year created July 1 through December 31st. As

a reminder, the appropriation for this fiscal year for general operations, which includes the oversight of casinos, iGaming and sports wagering is \$48,189,000.

It's funded from two primary sources. The first is \$40,489,000 from chargebacks against the percentage of the casino operator revenue and second is restricted revenue, 7.7 million dollars, which comes primarily from license fees, chargebacks for the operations of the gaming lab and the license application fees.

So to date, expenditures have totaled \$21,172,200. We are on target for the year and expenditures are in line with expectations, totaling 44 percent of the total appropriation through the first half. Ninety (90) percent, or 19.1 million dollars, of the Board expenses to date have been through payroll, with the remaining ten percent or 2.1 million dollars for the operating and fixed asset sides of the budget.

Overall expenditures for the first half of the fiscal year are up 1.3 million dollars from the same period the last fiscal year. This is primarily due to increases on the payroll side due to new casino openings and an increase in the personnel

complement to meet the demands of gaming expansion.

Payroll expenses are 19.1 million - or yeah, payroll expenses of 19.1 million dollars are up 1.2. million dollars or 6.6 percent from the same period last year and include 11.7 million dollars for salaries and leave payouts, and 7.4 million dollars for benefits. Benefits as a percentage of salaries are 62 percent of salary costs.

Operating and fixed-asset expenses total 2.1 million dollars, essentially, unchanged from the same period last fiscal year. And the primary expenses in this category are \$722,000 for real estate rentals and leases and \$605,000 for services, which are primarily inter-agency billings for services that the Board receives from other state agencies.

That concludes my remarks.

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   matters, the Board has received all the documents
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filed of record prior to today's meeting in advance of today's meeting.

The first of these Petitions pertains to GW Cumberland Op Co.'s Request for Approval of a Corporate Overhead and Shared Services Agreement with Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc.

By way of background, on January 19th, 2022, GW Cumberland Op Co. was awarded a Category 4 Slot Machine License and does business as Parx Casino Shippensburg. Parx Casino Shippensburg is scheduled to open in February 2023. And as Kevin just alluded to, they just had their test nights. Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc., on the other hand, holds a Category 1 Slot Machine License and owns and operates Parx Casino in Bensalem.

The Corporate Overhead and Shared
Services Agreement between GW Cumberland Op Co. and
Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment, Inc., will allow
Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment to provide
services to GW Cumberland Op Co. in connection with
the operation and management of its Category 4
facility, specifically providing for administrative,
corporate, managerial and operation support for GW
Cumberland. The Corporate Overhead and Shared
Services Assessment (sic) would run through December

31st, 2023 and then could automatically renew annually thereafter.

The OCC and BIE have reviewed this Agreement and they have no objection to the relief requested, subject to conditions outlined in their Answer, which primarily guarantee appropriate licensure of the parties that will be involved in this Agreement. OEC also has no objection to the Petitioner's Request for Confidentiality, and OEC, in fact, has requested confidentiality of certain information it has also provided of record. And this matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

ATTORNEY COOK: The next Petition before the Board today is Mount Airy #1, LLC's Petition to Amend two Trusts that have an ownership interest in the licensee. Mount Airy #1, LLC is the holder of a Category 2 Slot Machine License and operates the Mount Airy Casino Resort. Mount Airy is the wholly-owned subsidiary of Mount Airy HoldCo, LLC, and the ownership of HoldCo is vested in seven Trusts. Nicola DeNaples is a beneficiary of both the Grantor Trust-II of Lisa DeNaples and the Grantor Trust-II for the benefit of the Children of Nicholas DeNaples. And based on his status as a beneficiary of these two Trusts, Nicola is a beneficial owner of Mount Airy and is therefore licensed as a Principal.

In May of 2022, Mount Airy filed a

Petition requesting permission to amend the Trust to

remove Nicola as a beneficiary. The Board granted

that request with a condition requiring Mount Airy to

file a separate Petition seeking approval of the

amended Trust documents. Mount Airy filed that

specific request in October of 2022. The only change

to the Trust is the removal of Nicola as beneficiary,

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which will reallocate his interests to the remaining beneficiaries.

OEC has no objection to the requested relief, subject to the conditions outlined in their Answer, and this matter is now ripe for Board's consideration.

Mount Airy also 13 14 seeks approval of those amended Trusts.

OEC has no objection to the request, subject to the conditions outlined in their Answer. And additionally, OEC has no objection to the request for confidentiality relative to the Trust documents and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

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as a mechanism by which Anders Strohm held interest in Kambi. The Petition to Surrender stated that this interest, that is Mr. Strohm's interest, was transferred into a new entity and that Veralda AB was dissolved in September of 2022.

OEC's Answer to this Petition was initially due on November 28th, 2022. However, the Board's BIE initiated a full investigation into this matter and, therefore, OEC requested an extension to file an Answer as they needed to review - as they needed to review the results of BIE's investigation filing - prior to filing an informed Answer.

However, due to an administrative error caused by an automated system, the Petition was prematurely placed before the Board and granted on December 14th, 2022.

The request before the Board today is to vacate that December 14th Order and remand the matter back to the Office of Hearings and Appeals (OHA) so as to allow both BIE and OEC time to complete the investigation and file an informed Answer. This request is consistent with the Board's regulation addressing reconsideration of orders if that the request was filed within 15 days of the Order being issued, which is true in this case. And

Specifically, Mr. Maxwell failed to disclose a 2012 arrest for possession of marijuana. The Board granted OEC's request and issued an Order on July 10th, 2019 denying Mr. Maxwell's application.

On November 15th, 2022, Mr. Maxwell filed a Petition seeking permission to reapply for a Gaming Employee Occupation Permit. Mr. Maxwell included with his Petition a certification explaining the facts surrounding the denial of his application, acknowledging that he was given ample time to amend his application and failed to do so due to his lack of understanding of the investigation - the investigative and suitability process. He further stated that he has now been approved in other states to serve as a Slot Technician, and if given the opportunity, would like to apply to such positions in the Commonwealth.

The OEC has no objection to Mr.

Maxwell's request and the matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

On October 3rd, 2022, the OEC filed a Request for Emergency Suspension of Mr. Knight's Permit after receiving notice that he had been charged with criminal offenses stemming from allegations that he lied on applications to purchase firearms. As a result of these charges, the Board's Executive Director issued an Emergency Order suspending Mr. Knight's Permit as requested by OEC.

A hearing in this matter was held on October 20th, 2022. OEC appeared offering testimony and documentary evidence. Mr. Knight appeared but did not present any testimony. Based upon the evidence received, the Report and Recommendation issued in this matter recommends that given the nature of his pending offenses, the suspension of Mr. Knight's Gaming Permit is valid and should remain in effect.

This matter is now ready for the

five alone in their vehicle for approximately two hours between the hours of 3:00 and 5:00 a.m. while they attended the casino. No criminal charges were filed and Ms. Mack and her husband were permanently evicted from the casino.

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On July 5th, 2022, Ms. Mack filed a Petition Requesting Early Removal from the Involuntary Exclusion List. A hearing in this matter was held on October 4th, 2022. OEC appeared and presented testimony and documentary evidence. Mack appeared and testified on her own behalf. stated that she, her husband, her mother-in-law and her husband's stepfather, along with the children, had been traveling and had been driving for a long That they stopped at the casino and that the husband's stepfather was supposed to stay in the car while the children slept. She further stated that she did not know that her husband's stepfather had gone into the casino, leaving the children alone. She also stated that she is the stepmother of the children yet is the only one she feels being held responsible for the children being left in the vehicle. She believes that as the stepmother she should not be the one held responsible for the incident.

Subsequent to the hearing, a Report 1 2 and Recommendation was issued recommending denial of 3 Ms. Mack's Request for Early Removal from the 4 Involuntary Exclusion List, as she did not present 5 evidence of extraordinary circumstances, which would justify her removal from the list before at least 6 7 five years had run as required by the regulations. This matter is now ready for the 9 Board's consideration. 10 CHAIR: Any questions or comments from the Board? 11 12 May I have a motion, please? 13 MS. REGAN: Commissioner Regan moves 14 that the Board adopt the Report and Recommendation 15 issued by the OHA as described by the OCC and that 16 Jameila Mack remain on the Involuntary Exclusion 17 List. 18 MR. On September 29th, 2020 the Office of Enforcement Counsel (OEC) filed a Petition to place Rebecca Yandoli on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List after it was discovered that on November 16th, 2019 Ms. Yandoli left her four-year-old daughter alone in a hotel room at Wind Creek Bethlehem at around 1:00 a.m. while she gamed in the casino. Ms. Yandoli's daughter left the hotel room, attempted to enter several other rooms, and then took the elevator to the hotel lobby. Ms. Yandoli was then found on the Gaming Floor, and she was arrested and charged with Endangering the Welfare of a Child. A hearing in this matter was held in April in 2021 and on August 11th of that year, the Board issued an Order placing Ms. Yandoli on the Exclusion List.

On July 25th, Ms. Yandoli filed her Request for Removal from the Involuntary Exclusion List. OEC filed an Answer objecting to the request and a hearing was held in the matter October 25th of 2022. OEC appeared and testified and presented documentary evidence. Ms. Yandoli appeared and testified on her own behalf.

Ms. Yandoli testified that she successfully completed her probation in July of 2022,

approximately three years early, based on her Endangering the Welfare of a Child charge. Yandoli provided documentation supporting her testimony, which include character reference letters of the strides she had made in her life surrounding her parenting. She stated that she was driven to create a better life for her and her child, and she's trying to put this criminal conduct behind her and has no interest in gaming.

Subsequent to the hearing, the Report and Recommendation was issued, recommending denial of Ms. Yandoli's Request for Early Removal from the Exclusion List as she did not present any evidence of extraordinary circumstance that would justify removal from the list prior to five years.

This matter's now ready for the Board's consideration.

A hearing in this matter was held on October 11th of 2022. OEC appeared and presented testimony and documentary evidence. E.B. appeared and testified on his own behalf. OEC provided the testimony from the Director of the Board's Office of Compulsive and Problem Gambling regarding the self-exclusion documents and the acknowledgments that E.B. had signed choosing a self-exclusion period,

acknowledging that he was excluding himself from all Pennsylvania casinos and gaming-related activities, including retail sports wagering. E.B. signed all of these forms which told him that he could be banned from other venues, gaming and nongaming, including hotels and restaurants.

trouble controlling his betting while using interactive gaming applications, and that he decided to exclude himself because of the ease and use of frequency with which he would receive gambling notification offers. He further testified that while on the DraftKings' application, he was directed to the website for self-exclusion, and he believed that was in reference to the self-exclusion process for online casinos and not brick-and-mortar casinos. And that he would still like to play sports wagers at land-based casinos until he entered one and - attempted to enter one in May and was denied entry.

He further stated that he should have read the forms more thoroughly, that he is concerned that he is unable to go to casinos, restaurants or bars to watch sporting events with his friends. And that in exchange for removal from the casino Self-Exclusion List, he would agree to go on the

iGaming Self-Exclusion List.

Subsequently, a Report and Recommendation was issued denying - recommending denial of E.B.'s Petition, and that matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

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and Recommendation before the Board today stems from a request to recover funds that were confiscated from an individual while gaming - for gaming while on the Self-Exclusion List. As the Board is aware, when a self-excluded person is found in Pennsylvania casinos, the Act dictates that any winnings possessed by the person may - shall be confiscated from him or

her and used to support compulsive and problem gambling programs.

On June 15th, 2022, P.H. filed a

Petition for Recovery of Funds confiscated from her.

A hearing in this matter was held on October 27th,

2022. OEC appeared and presented testimony and
documentary evidence, and P.H. appeared and testified
on her own behalf.

The underlying facts in this matter are that on June 14th, 2019, P.H. met face to face with a Casino Compliance Representative at Rivers Casino Philadelphia and submitted a request to be placed on the Self-Exclusion List for a period of one year. At that time P.H. signed all the necessary paperwork for placement on the Self-Exclusion List, which included an acknowledgement that during the period of self-exclusion, P.H. could not collect any winnings or recover any losses resulting from gaming while on the list. And that she would remain on the list unless and until she requested and was granted removal.

On October 12th, 2020, while still on the Self-Exclusion List, P.H. gamed at Rivers

Philadelphia and won \$1,600 jackpot - a \$1,600

jackpot that was confiscated from her after being

identified as a self-excluded person. Casino personnel also confiscated P.H.'s remaining credits on the machine which she admitted to staff had previously been won during her time in the casino. The next day, October 13th, 2020, P.H. successfully completed the form for removal from the List.

In May 2022, P.H. contacted the Board's Bureau of Compulsive and Problem Gambling requesting that her removal date be modified because she believed that the Self-Exclusion program had been broken, and that her request was denied by the system operating improperly. P.H. also testified at the hearing that what prompted her to enter the facility after - during her period of self-exclusion was that she received an email from the facility regarding a promotional offer surrounding converting change to cash in exchange for potential free play.

After hearing all of the evidence presented, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that P.H.'s request be denied. And this matter's now ready for the Board's consideration.

The complaint has been filed with the Board's OHA and properly served upon the individual named in the complaint. The individual named in the complaint failed to respond within 30 days, as required by Board regulation. As a result, the OEC filed a Request for Default Judgement in the matter and properly served the same upon the Respondent.

Therefore, the facts in each - in the complaint are deemed admitted. All filed documents have been provided to the Board and the matter is presently ripe for the Board's consideration.

Ms. Reed was previously employed as an EVT Attendant at Lady Luck Casino.

Ms. Reed entered Lady Luck as a patron and gamed at slot machines prior to the end of her post-employment prohibition on wagering at the casino where she was once employed. Ms. Reed was on the Gaming Floor for approximately one hour prior to discovery by Lady Luck Security. Ms. Reed was escorted out of the casino but was not formally evicted. She is not currently employed in the Pennsylvania's gaming industry.

At this time the OEC requests that the Board suspend the Non-Gaming Employee Registration issued to Prudence Reed.

In each instance the Petition for Exclusion has been filed with the Board's OHA and properly served upon the individual named in the Petition. The individual named in each Petition failed to respond within 30 days, as required by Board regulation. As a result,

the OEC filed a Request for Default Judgement in each matter and properly served the same upon each individual.

Therefore, all facts in each Petition are deemed admitted. All filed documents have been provided to the Board and the matters are presently ripe for the Board's consideration. In each instance if the Board orders the proposed exclusion, each individual's photo, personal identifiers, and a summary of the inimical conduct will be placed on the Board's public website. Once again in each matter, we will provide a brief - a summary of the facts and make a request for the appropriate Board action.

ATTORNEY GORMAN: The next matter on the agenda is a request to place Zachary Jackson on the Involuntary Exclusion List.

child unattended at Harrah's Philadelphia Casino shortly after being turned away from the Gaming Floor by Security. Mr. Jackson told Security that there was another adult waiting in the vehicle in the parking garage who could watch the child.

Surveillance tracked the child and Mr. Jackson back to the vehicle and could not see an adult. Mr. Jackson left the child unattended in the lobby before

going back to the vehicle and returned to the casino. 1 2 3 Surveillance triggered notification to 4 Security at this time. Meanwhile, Mr. Jackson went 5 back to the Gaming Floor and went to the Sportsbook 6 in order to place a wager. In total, Mr. Jackson 7 left a 13-year-old child unattended for 15 minutes. No criminal charges were filed. Mr. Jackson was permanently evicted from Harrah's Philadelphia. 10 At this time the OEC requests that the 11 Board place Zachary Jackson on the Involuntary Exclusion List. 12 13 CHAIR: Any questions or comments from 14 the Board? No criminal charges were filed and Mr. Kachulis was permanently evicted from Live! Philadelphia.

The Pennsylvania State Police charged Mr. Madanat with Misdemeanor Manipulating a Win/Loss, Misdemeanor Fraudulent Claim, and Misdemeanor Theft charges. Mr. Madanat is currently in the Accelerated Disposition Program in Berks

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1 County. He was permanently evicted from Hollywood 2 Morgantown.

Officers arrived and stopped Ms. Mims and Mr. Pape in their vehicle. All stolen items were recovered. No criminal charges were filed. Mr. Pape and Ms. Mims were both permanently evicted from the casino.

Mr. Morant parked his car in the parking lot and left the car unattended. Security notified Valley Forge Surveillance of the incident and Mr. Morant's vehicle was located. Security also notified the Pennsylvania State Police and the Upper Merion Township Police Department. Mr. Morant was away from the child for five minutes. No criminal charges were filed, and Mr. Morant was permanently evicted from Valley Forge for his actions.

At this time the OEC requests that the Board place Matthew Morant on the Involuntary Exclusion List.
