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that will be made by our Executive Director, Kevin O'Toole. Kevin?

MR. O'TOOLE: Good morning, Chair Smyler, Members of the Board. So this morning we're going to recognize a number of individuals who have reached that milestone of either ten years of continuous service to the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board or 15 years of continuous service.

So it's really an enjoyable day to recognize the dedication and the loyalty of employees who have clearly and significantly contributed to the success of our agency. And I'd also like to note at this time that we have 359 Gaming Control Board employees as of today. 168 have reached at least ten years of service, which represents 47 percent of our employees. And of that 168, 116 of them have reached 15 years of service, which represents 32 percent of our employees.

So this morning we are fortunate to have two employees who were able to come in today in person and we can recognize them at this time. Our first honoree is Wayne Fritzinger. Wayne, could you stand up, please?

So Wayne is here for his 15th year Service Award. He was hired on May 4th of 2009 as

Casino Compliance Representative. Today, Wayne serves as our Casino Compliance Supervisor assigned to the Hollywood Morgantown Casino for the Bureau of Casino Compliance. Wayne, I'd like to present this Certificate to you, and thank you very much for your service and congratulations.

And, Mark, would you come up, please?

So, Mark Dinse, he is also receiving an honor for being a 15 year service award winner. Mark was hired on June 8 of 2009 as an Electronics Engineer. Today, Mark serves as a Manager of the Board's Office of Gaming Laboratory Operations. Mark, thank you very much for your service and congratulations, and I'd like to give you your Certificate.

I have a few more people that I would like to recognize, but if you don't mind, I'll sit down for that. So we also have five additional employees who reached their 15-year milestone, and they are Tom Wascura. Tom was hired on May 11 of 2009 as a Casino Compliance Representative. And then in December of 2020, Tom took the position as an iGaming Compliance Representative for the Bureau of Gaming Operations, and he continues to serve the agency in that capacity today.

Next, we have Jennifer Courtney

Martin. Jennifer was hired on June the 8th of 2009 as a Casino Compliance Representative assigned to the Meadows Casino. Jennifer continues to serve the agency in that capacity today. Next, we have Lauren Berry. Lauren was hired on July 16th of 2009 as an Electronics Engineer in the Office of Gaming Laboratory Operations and still serves the Agency in that capacity today.

And Joshua Hofrichter. Josh was hired on July 20th of 2009 as a Casino Compliance
Representative. In December of 2017, Josh was promoted to the position of Casino Compliance
Supervisor for the Meadows Casino within the Bureau of Casino Compliance. And the final 15-year award recognition goes to Katlyn Tortorice. Katlyn was hired on July 20th, 2009 as a Casino Compliance
Representative. In September of 2014, Katlyn took the position of Investigator for the Bureau of Investigations and Enforcement in the Western Region, and she serves the Agency in that capacity today.

We also have two employees who have reached ten years of service with the Board who were unable to come to Harrisburg today. The first is A.J. McConnell. A.J. was hired on June the 9th of 2014 as a Casino Compliance Representative. Since

January of 2020, A.J. has held the position of
Investigator for the Bureau of Investigation and
Enforcement in the Northeast Region. And finally,
Scott Brettell. Scott was hired on July the 28th,
2014, as a Casino Compliance Representative at Rivers
Casino Pittsburgh with the Bureau of Casino
Compliance. He still serves in this capacity today.

So, I'd also like to mention that the individuals in this category for 15 years, you know, were hired in that May, June, July 2009 timeframe of which I am one. So I am a 15-year veteran of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board. Thank you.

CHAIR: Thank you, Kevin. And congratulations to you, Kevin, for your 15 years of exceptional service to the Board.

MR. O'TOOLE: Thank you very much.

CHAIR: And thanks to all of you, for all of your years of service to the Board and to the citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

By way of Announcements, the Board held an Executive Session yesterday, Tuesday, July 23rd, to discuss personnel matters pending litigation and to conduct quasi-judicial deliberations relating to matters coming before the Board. I would also like to announce that the Board has rescheduled the

Public Input Hearing relative to the License Renewal Application for Wind Creek Bethlehem. The hearing will now be held on Wednesday, July 31st, beginning at 10:30 a.m. At the Bethlehem Townhall, located at 10 East Church Street, Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, 18018. The public is invited to attend and to provide testimony on the renewal of Wind Creek's License.

Now we again hear from our Executive Director, Kevin O'Toole.

MR. O'TOOLE: Chair and Members of the Board, for today's Executive Director's Report, I would like to talk about the National Counsel of Legislators from Gaming States, an organization referred to as NCLGS. They held their 2024 summer conference last week and most importantly, they held it in Pennsylvania.

They held it at the Rivers Casino

Pittsburgh, and many of the attendees stayed at the

Landing Hotel, which is the hotel that rivers opened

fairly recently. And the conference rooms were all

fairly new. They have had an event center for the

last four or five years, but they expanded that even

more into a lot of breakout seminar rooms, which

accommodated this group very well.

The Conference brought in over 300 attendees. I know that the organizers were very pleased with that attendance, and the Gaming Control Board had three representatives on panels during that conference, and I was glad about that.

Paul Resch, our Director of the Bureau of Gaming Operations, was on a panel regarding the challenges that regulators have faced in the area of Interactive Gaming. Lee Copello, our Director of iGaming Operations, appeared on the panel that discussed best practices for developing good regulations covering iGaming activity, and I appeared on the panel on the opening day that dealt with aspects of iGaming activity and how could you encourage legislators in other states to move forward with iGaming legislation since there are only seven jurisdictions that have legalized iGaming to date? And when you compare that to sports wagering, where there's been 38 jurisdictions, you can see that dichotomy.

So my emphasis was on how the legislation, particularly here in Pennsylvania, you know, has effectively allocated tax revenue so that the taxes that benefit the Commonwealth have a very broad - a very broad category of the population,

since - since one of the most significant uses of that tax revenue is for property tax reduction, which covers any homeowner who applies for that benefit.

Overall, it was a very informative conference, and I am hopeful that NCLGS will return to Pennsylvania soon to sponsor another conference. That concludes my Report. Thank you.

CHAIR: Thank you, Kevin. And Commissioner Dermody also attended, and he will concur with the fact that it was a wonderful conference.

Now we will hear from our Director of Budget, Dave Rhen. Dave?

MR. RHEN: Good morning, Chair Smyler and Board Members. Today I'll present the Final Report of Expenditures for Fiscal Year '23-'24, which ended on June 30th. Although the year is over, we continue to receive and process invoices, so I am including some anticipated expenses in the numbers that I provide today.

\$51.99 million against an appropriation of \$52.16 million. That will leave us with an ending balance of around \$170,000. Overall, expenditures increased by \$4.3 million, or 9.1 percent due to an increase in

personnel costs. Ninety (90) percent of our expenditures, or \$46.6 million, were for salaries and benefits, with the remaining 10 percent, or \$5.4 million for operating expenses.

Personnel expenses consisted of \$27.1 million for salaries, \$19.3 million for benefits and \$250,000 for retirement leave payouts. Benefits as percentage of salaries, were 70 percent. Overall, personnel costs increased by \$4.9 million, or 11.7 percent from the prior year. This was a result of the expansion of our agency complement and increases in salary costs.

In the operating category,
expenditures were \$5.4 million. The largest
expenditures were \$1.8 million for services. This is
predominantly interagency billings to other

Commonwealth agencies for services that they provide
to the Board, \$1.7 million for rentals and leases,
and \$1.1 million for other operating expenses, which
is predominantly database services that we use for
Background Investigations.

Operating expenses decreased by \$550,000 from the prior year. That concludes my remarks on '23-'24. For '24-'25, our appropriation has been enacted and the budget for the current year

is \$57,222,000. And that concludes my remarks.

present to you is from the Cumberland County District Attorney's Office, who's seeking a grant of \$149,569.

If awarded, this would be their fifth grant.

The grant is entitled to pay for full-time detective, a half-time ADA salary and benefits, overtime, training, and also miscellaneous expenses in order to conduct their investigations and enforce laws involving unlawful gaming. This matter is ready for the Board's consideration.

are four Petitions. These Petitions will be decided on a documentary record as the OEC has no objection to the requested relief, or in the case of the first matter because the Board has no authority to grant the requested relief.

In each of these matters, the Board has, in advance of the meeting, been provided with all the documents filed of record. Thomas Fiore's Motion to Protect Confidential Information is the first request before the Board today. In December of 2022, the OEC filed a Complaint seeking to revoke Mr. Fiore's Gaming Employee Occupation Permit for conduct which occurred while he was employed at the Rivers Pittsburgh Casino.

Following a hearing in the matter, a
Report and Recommendation was issued, and on June
28th, 2023, the Board revoked Mr. Fiore's permit.

Nine months later, on March 6, 2024, Mr. Fiori filed
a motion to protect confidential information
requesting that the Board make his entire case file
confidential. Specifically, Mr. Fiore states that
the record should be confidential because the
revocation complaint incorrectly stated a date that
certain actions took place - excuse me. That because
he settled a wrongful termination claim with the

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Rivers Casino pursuant to a confidentiality clause, and finally, because the criminal charges relating to the matter were pleaded down to a summary offense.
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Enforcement Counsel filed an Answer objecting to Mr. Fiore's request on numerous grounds, including that he failed to comply with the Board regulations and provide a legal basis for his confidentiality request, as well as that the information is requesting to keep confidential does not fall within the definition of confidential information as described by the Gaming Act and the Board's regulations, and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

ATTORNEY COOK: Next before the Board is Samuel Rice's request for removal from the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List. By way of background, on June 3rd, 2016, Mr. Rice, who was 19-years old at the time, presented a fake identification at SugarHouse Casino in Philadelphia, now Rivers Philadelphia, and gained entry to the casino where he engaged in table games play for over half an hour, and consumed alcoholic beverages.

consequently, Mr. Rice and the OEC entered into a Consent Agreement approved by the Board on June 7, 2017. The Agreement placed Mr. Rice on the Involuntary Exclusion List until the earlier of his 22nd birthday or one year from the date the Consent Agreement was approved by the Board, whichever occurred first.

At the appropriate time, Mr. Rice - or pursuant to the terms of the Consent Agreement, at the appropriate time, Mr. Rice would have to Petition the Board seeking removal from the List. It has now been nearly six years since Mr. Rice was eligible to remove himself from the list or request removal from the list. The OEC has no objection to Mr. Rice - Mr. Rice's request given he has complied with the terms

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of the Consent Agreement and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

List. On July 10th, 2011, an individual with the initials S.S. placed himself on the list, choosing a lifetime self-exclusion option.

On April 23rd, 2024, S.S. filed a request to be removed from the list. S.S. included with his Petition two Problem Gambling Assessment Verification Forms, both signed by certified assessment providers confirming that assessments of

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S.S. were performed and that problem gambling treatment was not recommended.
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He additionally provided documentation relative to his removal from the Maryland Self-Exclusion List. The OEC filed an Answer stating it had no objection to S.S.'s request for removal from the Self-Exclusion List as more than ten years has passed since his placement on the list, he submitted all the required documentation and there were no known violations of his self-exclusion.

This matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

On June 11, 2013, and individual with the initials L.H. placed herself on the list, choosing the lifetime self-exclusion option. On May 8th, 2024, almost 11 years after placement on the List, L.H. filed a Request to be removed from the List. L.H. included with her Petition, a Problem Gambling Assessment Verification Form signed by a certified assessment provider, confirming that an assessment of L.H. was performed and that Problem Gambling treatment was not recommended.

L.H. did, in fact, have two violations of her Self-Exclusion ban; one in 2014 where she was present in a Pennsylvania casino but did not game, and a second one in 2015 where she gamed at Sands BethWorks at the time, now Wind Creek, for approximately two and-a-half hours. The OEC filed Answer to LH's Petition for Removal, saying that they had no objection to L.H.'s request as it has been over 11 years since her placement on the list, she's provided all the necessary documentation, and although she twice violated the self-exclusion, her most recent violation was over nine years ago and this matter's now ripe for the Board's consideration.

Marcus Anastasiadis is the first

Report and Recommendation before the Board today. On

October 18th, 2023, Mr. Anastasiadis submitted an

Application for a Non-Gaming Employee Registration

seeking work as an EVS attendant at Mount Airy Casino

Resort.

In January of 2024, the OEC sent Mr. Anastasiadis a Notice recommending denial of his Application based on his criminal record and debts owed to the court. Specifically, in 2015, Mr. Anastasiadis was convicted of misdemeanor offense related to fleeing/attempting to elude police, in which he was sentenced to two to 23 months incarceration. In 2017, he was again charged with the same offense, but a felony count, and sentenced

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to 9 to 23 months incarceration. And in 2022, he was charged with a driving under the influence offense and admitted into the Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition program.

A hearing in this matter was held in April of 2024. OEC appeared offering testimony and documentary evidence. Despite receiving proper notice, Mr. Anastasiadis failed to appear and the hearing was held in his absence. Consequently, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that Mr. Anastasiadis's Application for a registration be denied, and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: Tyshyn Harmon is the next Report and Recommendation before the Board today. The Board heard Mr. Harmon's matter originally at the June 26, 2024 meeting in which Mr. Harmon appeared and spoke to the Board. This matter was tabled pending additional documentation to be provided by Mr. Harmon. Mr. Harmon did comply with the Board's request and provided several character reference letters to the Board. Unfortunately, Mr. Harmon notified OCC last evening that he would not be able to attend today's meeting.

I will briefly review the facts in this matter that were presented to the Board during the June 26 meeting. Mr. Harmon holds both a Gaming Employee Occupation Permit and a Non-Gaming Employee Registration. He previously worked as a games presenter at Evolution US, LLC and he is currently employed as a table games dealer at Wind Creek Bethlehem.

In October of 2023, the OEC filed a Complaint to revoke Mr. Harmon's permit and registration upon learning that while dealing Live

Dealer Blackjack for Evolution, he manipulated the cards he was shuffling to ensure that a patron would win certain hands.

A hearing to address this matter was held in March of 2024. OEC appeared and offered testimony, documentary and surveillance evidence.

Mr. Harmon appeared and testified on his own behalf. Following a hearing, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that Mr. Harmon's registration and permit be revoked. However, this matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: The next Report and Recommendation before the Board today stems from Jessica Keys' request to lift the suspension of her Gaming Employee Occupation Permit. By way of background, Miss Keys held a permit and was employed as a table games dealer at Valley Forge Casino.

In March 2022, the OEC filed a request for an emergency suspension of Miss Key's permit after receiving notice that she had been charged with several felony and misdemeanor offenses. After she and a conspirator are alleged to have forced their way into a victim's home to assault, and then threaten the victim and her family. A hearing on

this matter was held in April of 2022, and subsequently the Board issued an order June 15, 2022, continuing the suspension of her permit.

In September of 2023, Miss Keys filed a request with the Board to lift the suspension of her permit, stating that she had been acquitted of the felony charges and was only convicted of misdemeanors. OEC filed answer objecting the request, and her hearing was held December of 2023. OEC appeared offering testimony and documentary evidence. Miss Keys also appeared and testified on her own behalf. Following the hearing, a Hearing Officer issued an Order permitting Ms. Keys to file character statements in support of her.

Miss Keys did file several character reference letters and an additional hearing was held March of 2024, allowing her to provide additional testimony on the submitted exhibits. Miss Keys testified that she is the sole provider for her four children, that the criminal incident was domestic in nature and she is not a threat to the general community. She has never been in trouble before this incident, either criminally or during her work at the casino. She further stated that she had been employed at Valley Forge for seven years, that she

loved working there, and that they had respected and supported her through all of the issues.

She further testified that Valley
Forge had even paid for her to move out of the area
to get away from the domestic situation she found
herself in with the ex-boyfriend that led to the
criminal incident. The Hearing Officer issued a
Report and Recommendation recommending that the
suspension of Miss Keys' Gaming Employee Occupation
Permit be terminated and this matter is now ripe for
the Board's consideration.

Mr. Polonsky had been issued a Non-Gaming Employee Registration and previously worked as a cocktail server at Parx Casino. On October 3rd, 2023, OEC filed a request for an emergency suspension of Mr. Polonsky's registration after receiving notice he had been charged with several felony and misdemeanor offenses related relating to possession and dissemination of child pornography.

As a result of these charges, the
Board's Executive Director issued an emergency order
on the same day suspending Mr. Polonsky's
registration as requested by OEC. A hearing in this
matter was held in December of 2023. OEC appeared,
presenting testimony and documentary evidence.

Despite receiving proper notice, Mr. Polonsky failed
to appear. After the initial hearing date, Mr.

Polonsky contacted OHA stating he had marked down the
incorrect date for the hearing and asked if another
could be rescheduled.

His request was granted and a new hearing was held January 31st, 2024. OEC appeared. However, Mr. Polansky, again, failed to appear. He

did request another continuance, which was granted and rescheduled. However, once again, Mr. Polonsky did not appear at that rescheduled date.

Consequently, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that suspension of Mr. Polonsky's registration remain in effect, and this matter's now ready for the Board's consideration.

She further claimed that the fighters had similar names and she mistook the name of a fighter that actually had lost to the one she placed her wager on and therefore threw out her ticket. Miss Harrison included pictures with her Petition, which she claimed show her hand holding the winning ticket.

In November of 2023, both OEC and Presque Isle Downs, after being added to the matter at the request of OEC, filed Answers objecting to Miss Hairston's Petition. A hearing in this matter was held in February 2024. Miss Hairston failed to appear and OEC made an oral motion to deny her Petition. However, after the hearings, Miss Hairston sent an email to the Board Clerk requesting another hearing date, saying she was unable to attend due to a maintenance issue. Her request was granted and a new hearing was scheduled in March of 2024. She once again, however, failed to appear.

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On April 5, 2024, the OHA issued a

testimony, documentary and surveillance evidence.

A.D. appeared and testified on his own behalf. The

underlying facts in this matter are that on January

26, 2012, A.D. placed himself on the Board's Self
Exclusion List for a period of five years, signing

the acknowledgments, which included an

acknowledgement that he was prohibited from

collecting any winnings, money, or thing of value

from gaming activity while on the List.

On December 27th into 28th of 2023, A.D. entered Mount Airy and played blackjack while still on the Self-Exclusion List. Upon discovering that he was still on the List, security confiscated \$16,000 in gaming chips from him. A.D. was then charged with trespass for this incident.

During A.D.'s testimony at the hearing, he stated that he had moved to Florida soon after placing himself on the list, was back in Pennsylvania on vacation, and did not realize that he had to request removal and believed he had no longer been on the list as it had been 12 years since its placement on the list.

He further stated that due to the length of time he had been on the list, he believes the Board should waive the prohibition and he should be able to collect the entire \$16,000. A.D. has now completed the required paperwork and has been removed from the Self-Exclusion List.

After hearing all the evidence presented, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that A.D.'s Petition be granted in part and that he be allowed to recover the value of his last buy-in amount, which was \$3,000, as that amount was not winnings and this matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

documentary and testimonial evidence. S.A. appeared

and testified on her own behalf. Evidence presented

at the hearing showed that in February 2018, S.A.

completed all the necessary Self-Exclusion paperwork,

choosing the one-year self-exclusion period.

On January 11, 2024, S.A. entered Rivers Casino Pittsburgh and gamed while still on the Self-Exclusion List. She placed a \$5 side wager while playing blackjack and won \$5,000, ultimately discovering that she was still on the List, casino staff confiscated her winnings. She was then evicted and charged with trespass. During S.A.'s testimony, she acknowledged that she was still on the List while

gaming at Rivers Pittsburgh, but only found out that day because she had forgotten that she was required to remove herself from the List at the end of her Self-Exclusion period.

She further stated that she had patronized a different casino in 2021, had won money, but was not identified as a self-excluded individual. After hearing all the evidence, the Hearing Officer issued a Report and Recommendation recommending that the Petition be denied, and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

The next four matters on the agenda consist of Enforcement actions in which the OEC filed Complaints seeking the revocation or suspension of licenses, permits, or registrations previously issued by the Board.

The Complaint in each matter has been filed with the Board's OHA and properly served upon the individual named in each complaint. The individual named in each complaint failed to respond within 30 days as required by Board regulation. As a result, the OEC filed a request for Default Judgment in each instance and properly served the same upon each Respondent. Therefore, the facts in each complaint are deemed admitted. All filed documents have been provided to the Board and the matters are presently ripe for the Board's consideration. In each matter, we will provide a brief summary of the facts and make a request for the appropriate Board

action.

ATTORNEY GROODY: Good morning, Chair,
Members of the Board. Sara Groody, G-R-O-O-D-Y,
Assistant Enforcement Counsel with the OEC.
The next matter on the Agenda for the Board's
consideration is the revocation of the Gaming
Employee Occupation Permit issued to Rene Fraser.
Mr. Fraser was previously employed as a Sportsbook
Representative at Hollywood Casino Penn National.

Mr. Fraser was caught stealing while working at a cash register and was terminated from his position. Mr. Fraser was observed voiding sales, ringing sales with an employee discount, although an employee was not making the purchase and underringing items. Mr. Fraser was also observed putting money into his tip jar, meant as payment towards items. He was criminally charged for these actions and pled guilty to disorderly conduct.

Additionally, he pled guilty to disorderly conduct for another unrelated offense. He has notified the Board of these charges and he is not currently employed in the Pennsylvania gaming industry. At this time, the OEC requests the Board revoke the Gaming Employee Occupation Permit issued to Rene Fraser.
