                   The Gaming Control Board recently
24
   issued a Resolution recognizing the significance of
25
   problem gambling and the need to highlight resources
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that support prevention, education, treatment and recovery. Key personnel with our Office of Compulsive and Problem Gambling attended two conferences, one on the eastern part of the Commonwealth and one out west, presented by the Council on Compulsive Gambling of Pennsylvania. And our Director of the Office of Compulsive and Problem Gambling, Liz Lanza, testified on Monday before the House Gaming Oversight Committee.

Liz did a great job of presenting a gaming regulator's role in regard to addressing issues related to compulsive and problem gambling. For today's Executive Director's report, I would like to take this opportunity to update the Board on the topic of self-imposed limits, SILs, a topic that I presented in October of last year.

Gaming Control Board Regulations at Section 814 offer betters a number of responsible gaming self-imposed limits. These limits allow a gambler to control the amount of their deposits to their online gaming accounts. It allows the online player the ability to set a maximum amount per wager, to set a maximum amount of funds the player wants to spend during their online gaming session. And if necessary, the player can activate for themselves a

cooling-off period during which their online wagering account is deactivated from play. And that cooling-off period is completely separate and apart from our own self-exclusion program.

One requirement that does exist for the cooling off period is that the requirement is that the patron must impose a minimum of 72 hours of a cooling-off period, a three-day period of time.

Board staff has been able to monitor the use of these self-imposed limits on a monthly basis through the assistance of online gaming operators who provide the statistics to our Office of Compulsive and Problem Gambling, and those statistics come from the registered player accounts.

The most used limit is the deposit limit and the second most used limit is the self-suspension or cool-down period. The statistics show a significant increase in the use of those two player self-imposed limits and increases are good. We want gamblers to look for ways to help control their spending habits and their gambling activity.

In August of 2024, deposit limits were activated over 193 times during that month. In February of 2025, activation of deposit limits increased to over 285,000 times. So, very good

increase in that control. Similarly, the self-suspension cool-down periods were used over 105,000 times in August of 2024 and that increased to 141,000 times in February of 2025.

One additional statistic that is very probative of the discussion of self-imposed limits is the percentage of Pennsylvania online accounts that used a self-imposed limit to help control their gambling activity. The utilization rate for self-imposed limits increased from 4 percent to 4.43 percent of Pennsylvania online account holders during a six-month period. So, six months ago four percent of all players used one or more of those limits and that increased three quarters of a percent within a six-month period.

And also, one final matter would be that the Office of Communications has added a new employee, Kristina Kwolek to enhance and modernize important messages from the Gaming Control Board to a broader audience. Such topics will include problem gambling and how the Gaming Control Board's regulations help to protect the gaming public. The messages will provide a fresh look and will be communicated through social media channels. We are excited about this effort to provide the public with

a deeper understanding about the work we do and bring new information to them about legalized gambling in the Commonwealth.

And before I take my seat, on behalf of myself and the staff of the Gaming Control Board, I would like to thank Commissioner Dave Hickernell for his outstanding service to the Gaming Control Board over the last two years and staff wish you all the best in your retirement from public service. Thank you, Dave.

ATTORNEY COOK: First order of business today under the Office of Chief Counsel report is consideration of six petitions. Each of these petitions being brought before the Board today are being brought pursuant and being considered pursuant to the documentary record, as the Office of Enforcement Counsel has no objections to any of the requests. Prior to the Board meeting today, the Board has been provided with the complete evidentiary record and all documents filed of record.

The first Petition before the Board today is a joint request by Galaxy Gaming-01, LLC, Evolution Malta Holding Limited and Galaxy Gaming Ventures, LLC. It seeks approval of a merger and change in control that will result with - that will involve two of our licensed operators.

Manufacturer that develops and distributes table games and iGaming products. It is wholly and directly-owned by Galaxy Gaming, Inc., a publicly traded company. The acquiring company is Evolution AB, a publicly-traded company based in Sweden. Evolution AB is 100 percent direct owner of Evolution Malta Limited, who is the 100 percent direct owner of Evolution US, LLC, also a Licensed Gaming

Manufacturer by the Board - or pursuant to a Board Order.

On July 18, 2024, the parties entered into an agreement and a plan of merger to effectuate the purchase of 100 percent of the securities of Galaxy Gaming, Inc., by Evolution Malta, along with two individuals, Jesper Von Bahr and Martin Carlesund, both of whom are already licensed by the Board pursuant to their involvement with the Evolution Corporations. The final result of this merger will consist of Mr. Bahr, Mr. Carlesund and Evolution AB shareholders through intermediary companies they control being the ultimate owners of Galaxy-01.

The OEC has no objection to this change in control, subject to conditions outlined in their Answer. OEC also requests that certain matters in the pleadings be maintained as confidential. Upon review of that request, the OCC has determined that those documents are already in the public record, in the public view, so, we'd recommend that request be denied, and this matter is now recommended for consideration by the Board.

hearing after receiving the complaint, but
subsequently signed a waiver foregoing her right to a
hearing, thereby allowing the Board to decide this
matter on the documents filed of record, and this
matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

Additionally, the persons involved have each been notified that the Board would be considering their matter today and that each would have the ability to come forward and briefly address the Board.

The first Report and Recommendation

before the Board today is Brian Goodfellow. Mr.

Goodfellow holds a Gaming Level 2 Employee Occupation

Permit and previously worked as a Player Services

Cage Assistant Manager at Hollywood Casino

Morgantown. On April 9, 2024, the OEC filed a

complaint for emergency suspension of Mr.

Goodfellow's G2 Permit after receiving notice that he

had been charged with a felony offense. As a result

of these charges, the Board's Executive Director

issued an Emergency Order suspending Mr. Goodfellow's

G2 Permit.

A hearing in this matter was held June 7, 2024. OEC appeared for the hearing and presented

testimony and documentary evidence. Mr. Goodfellow appeared and testified on his own behalf. Evidence and testimony at the hearing showed that Mr. Goodfellow, while employed at Hollywood Casino Morgantown, failed to report his income on applications he was filling out to receive LIHEAP and SNAP benefits, which resulted in him receiving over \$5,900 in benefits between December 1st, 2022 and April 30, 2023, to which he was not entitled.

Mr. Goodfellow testified that his attorney and the Office of Inspector General had reached an agreement wherein the charge would ultimately be dismissed upon him repaying the benefits received. He further stated that the repayment would be satisfied, he believes, in July or August 2024. Mr. Goodfellow also testified that his failure to disclose the income was inadvertent as he mistakenly reported to the income to the wrong office.

Following a hearing, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that the suspension of Mr. Goodfellow's G2 Permit remain in effect. Since the issuance of the Report and Recommendation, Mr. Goodfellow supplemented the record with correspondence from his public defender

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noting the status of this case. This letter was provided to both the Board and OEC.
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This matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

Briefly, for the record, Ms.

Washington was originally placed on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List after leaving three children, ages 15, 14 and 10, unattended in a vehicle for approximately two hours at 1:00 a.m. outside Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course. The Report and Recommendation in this matter recommended that Ms. Washington's Petition for Removal from the Involuntary Exclusion List be denied. And Ms. Washington is here, and this matter is ready for the Board's consideration.

CHAIR: Chad, did you want to give us a few more details of the incident at issue for the record?

ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: Well, in this incident, she was placed on the List, leaving three children unattended at Hollywood Casino from 1:00

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a.m. to 3:00 \text{ p.m.} - 3:00 \text{ a.m.}, sorry. She appeared

I went through eviction, couldn't get the funds to get a place, so I had to hop house to house - well, hotel to hotel to get a stable place for my kids to sleep. When I went in there, they was sleeping. My oldest daughter, I told her, I'm gonna go in here, try to get some money so I could pay for the hotel.

these are my younger three.

So I did make the money. I was getting ready to leave, the security came and said, someone hit my car. You have to go right now because they hit your car. So I was, like, oh, my God. My children are in the car. My children - my daughter didn't even call me. So, I went out there. They asked me questions, told me I had to leave.

So, then I left. They called children and services on me. They came to the house. They

said I explained to them everything - well to the hotel. I told them everything that happened, and they just dropped the case. Then the casino said that I had to stay away for a year. I stayed away for a year, came back, they gave me a new card and then I played.

I've been playing, and that's been it.

I haven't had any other issues, but then now they kicked me out again. And then they were sending mail to the old address, but I didn't live there. So, that's why it took so long for me to come here or talk to someone, because they didn't have the right address, because I didn't have an address. And they sent me multiple letters, they said, but to - to the old address, but I never received anything because people moved into the house.

So, I guess I - I don't know what they did to the mail, and I didn't know that I can transfer or ask the post office to hold my mail. I didn't know that until recently, that they can put a hold on any mail that comes to that address. I still don't receive a lot of mail. And I'm now at a new residence. I got housing. I've been there for a year and - almost two years. And now I'm financially stable, but I feel as though I shouldn't be -.

1 I did what they asked me, to stay away 2 for the year and - and then I came back after the 3 year. So, I don't feel as though I should be - I don't know what the word is, for a lifetime. 4 5 CHAIR: It's excluded, and it's for 6 five years, not for a lifetime. 7 MS. WASHINGTON: They told me, it's 8 They said life. the life. 9 ATTORNEY COOK: She would have to 10 petition to come off after five years, but which would be September of 2028. 11 12 ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: And Hollywood may have issued a lifetime after the fact. Just -. 13 14 CHAIR: Okay. 15 But technically, you could petition 16 after five years to come off the List. Not - you don't have to wait a whole lifetime. 17 18 Okay? 19 So anyway, do you have anything else, 20 Ms. Washington? 21 MS. you said you were stable now, you've been living at

MS. WASHINGTON: My children are with me. I'm disabled, so I'm not working. I received Social Security now.

MS. MANZANO-DÍAZ: Okay.

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Ms. Washington, I have a couple of questions for you.

MS. WASHINGTON: People was helping me and I was going to the casino because I was - I was at the level to where they gave me free money when I didn't have money. So, the free money I would play, and like when you play and you win, you cash out. So they'll give you a ticket of the stuff that you won.

But the money that you put in that was free, you don't get it out. So, I had to play that in order to get - raise it up to get money out of the machine to go pay.

CHAIR: So, you were gambling, thinking you could win every time and get money?

MS. WASHINGTON: Basically, I did

almost - almost every time.

CHAIR: You're an unusual gambler.

So, why did you wait until 1:00 in the morning? You can check into a hotel at 3:00 or 4:00 in the afternoon.

MS. WASHINGTON: Right.

On July 17, 2024, the OEC filed a

Petition to place Melanie Crockett on the Involuntary

Interactive Gaming Exclusion List. A hearing in this

matter was originally scheduled for November 13,

2024. Ms. Crockett requested a continuance, which

was granted, and a hearing was rescheduled and held

December 10, 2024.

OEC appeared, presenting testimony and documentary evidence. Although receiving proper notice, Mr. Crockett failed to appear. The evidence and testimony at the hearing showed that in December 2020, Ms. Crockett created fraudulent iGaming accounts using the BetMGM platform. These accounts were flagged by BetMGM when one of the accounts created utilized the name of a deceased individual. BetMGM began an investigation and were able to link all of the fraudulent accounts to one another.

Ms. Crockett created the accounts

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using the individual's personal identifying
information, receiving the $25 welcome bonus in each
account that are provided when a new account is
created and gamed with those funds.

Consequently, a Report and
Recommendation was issued recommending that Ms.

Crockett be placed on the Board's Involuntary
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Crockett be placed on the Board's Involuntary

Interactive Gaming Exclusion List. And this matter
is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

The evidence and testimony presented show that on September 18, 2022, a patron reported to casino staff that there were two unattended children, who turned out to be ages 13 and 8, in a vehicle located at the parking lot at Valley Forge Casino Resort.

Video surveillance showed that Mr.

Martinez and Gloria Chacon, the children's mother,

left the children unattended in a vehicle, entered

the casino and gamed. Upon being approached by

security, Mr. Martinez was escorted back to the

vehicle where Pennsylvania State Police were speaking

with the children. The children were left alone for

approximately 52 minutes. No criminal charges were

filed against the individuals.

Mr. Martinez testified that he told
Ms. Chacon she needed to remain with her children
while he gamed at the casino, but that she responded
to him, stating that she wanted to game as well. He

further stated that he told her to go back to the car as the children were her responsibility, but that she refused.

After hearing all the evidence presented, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that Mr. Martinez be placed on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List. And this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

Ms. Wang requested a hearing which was held October of 2024. OEC appeared, presenting testimony, documentary and surveillance evidence.

Ms. Wang failed to appear at the hearing and it was held in her absence. However, after the hearing, Ms. Wang contacted the OHA indicating that she thought the hearing was for the following day. Another hearing was held in December of 2024 where Ms. Wang appeared and testified on her own behalf.

The evidence and testimony at the hearing showed that on April 21, 2023, Ms. Wang and a male companion left an eight-year old alone in a hotel room at Live! Casino and Hotel in Philadelphia. While the couple entered the casino, while Ms. Wang's companion gamed, she ordered takeout from one of the restaurants and then obtained a Player's Card.

Ms. Wang's daughter left the hotel room and came down to the lobby where she was approached by an employee. Pennsylvania State Police were contacted and Ms. Wang, as she walked towards - and confronted Ms. Wang as she walked towards the hotel from the casino lobby.

Thereafter, Ms. Wang, her companion and her daughter left the property. Ms. Wang's daughter was left unattended for just shy of an hour. No charges were filed, but she was issued a permanent eviction from the property. Ms. Wang then violated her eviction on four separate occasions. Ms. Wang testified that she was only picking up dinner from inside the casino and that it's unfair to exclude her from all casinos as opposed to just Live! where the incident occurred.

After hearing all the evidence presented, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that Mengshi Wang be placed on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

The only, and I'm going to put this in quotes, violation of her Exclusion was when she went to the casino believing that she was only excluded from Hollywood, not from all Pennsylvania casinos, and only for a one-year period. And then she was cited for trespass at the time, but that was in October of 2023, after she had been placed on the Board's Exclusion List.

ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: And the Report and Recommendation was to deny the Petition because it is an early request and not enough grounds were given to provide extraordinary circumstances that would warrant early removal.

ATTORNEY CROHE: Thank you, Chair,

Members of the Board, John Crohe, C-R-O-H-E, Senior

Enforcement Counsel for the OEC. The next matter on the agenda concerns sports wagering errors.

On March 31, 2023, the Meadows selfreported 35 incidents of past-posted sports wagers.

Specifically, on March 30th, 2023 at the Meadows
Retail Sportsbook at which bookmaking services are
provided by Kambi, one individual pass-posted 35
wagers. Each of the wagers were placed on variations
of the result of the next pitch markets during the
Major League Baseball game between the Cincinnati
Reds and the Pittsburgh Pirates. The patron placed
each wager at sports wagering kiosks 109 and 110.
The wagers were made in the total stake amount of
\$69,329, which ultimately paid out a total of
\$100,947 resulting in a loss to the facility of
\$31,617.75.

On April 5th, 2023, The Meadows

submitted an error report indicating that this incident was able to occur because the Kambi trader assigned to the game failed to close the events in a timely manner and failed to notice the multiple bets were made by the same two kiosks after the outcome was known.

The Meadows further explained that the Kambi supervisory team failed to notice the wagers. Trader refers to the individual responsible for creating offerings on which individuals can place wagers and in the instance relevant hereto, manually closing the offerings upon completion of the event on which the offering is available.

On April 11, 2023, Kambi provided an incident report to the Meadows stating that the cause of the error which resulted in the past-posting was manual trading errors wherein the trader was late to update pitches on numerous occasions during the time of the incident.

In each incident, the event was closed between 6 and 40 seconds after the pitch occurred.

All impacted wagers were settled and the patron who pass-posted the 35 wagers, cashed out all associated tickets. Pursuant to the regulations, wagering devices shall prevent past-posting of wagers and the

voiding or cancellation of wagers after the outcome of the event is known.

The OEC, Washington Trotting

Association, LLC, doing business as Hollywood Casino at the Meadows and Sports Information Services

Limited, doing business as, Kambi, respectfully request that the Board approve the Consent Agreement and Stipulations of Settlement and that the Washington Trotting Association, LLC, doing business as, Hollywood Casino at the Meadows and Sports Information Services Limited, doing business as, Kambi, pay total civil penalty of \$10,000, as well as a \$2,500 administrative fee for costs incurred by Board staff in connection with investigations into this matter.

CHAIR: Thank you. Hollywood and Kambi, would you like to address the Board?

MR. DUFFY: Madam Chair, Members of the Board, my name is Jack Duffy. I'm the Sportsbook Regulatory Lead at Kambi. As a member of the Sportsbook Control Department, one of our main responsibilities is incident management. We manage the reporting of the PGCB, as well as ensuring proper remedial actions after each incident. I appreciate the opportunity to give you a couple remarks and feel

free to ask questions after.

He explained the incident a little bit, but basically it was opening day in 2023, I guess at Hollywood Casino at the Meadows placed 35 wagers on live instant markets after the outcomes were already known in the Pittsburgh Pirates and Cincinnati Reds game.

This opening day also introduced several new rule changes, most notably the pitch clock. This adjustment led to a significantly faster paced game, reducing the average game time by over 30 minutes. Some consider that the most significant change in MLB history.

So, this incident was caused by a manual error from the trader assigned to the match. They were simply late to update the pitch result on numerous occasions. It did not appreciate what the ramifications of the this would be.

Additionally, we would expect our trading support staff responsible for monitoring bets to have identified the issue sooner. While they did notice the bets in real time, they initially did not believe them to be past-posting. Following the incident, we conducted a thorough review of our processes to ensure this error would not happen

again. Performance review tickets were raised for all staff involved and they received feedback on how they could have handled the situation better. To prevent future issues, additional trading support staff were scheduled to ensure proper coverage for all MLB games.

Additionally, the trading team was reminded to adjust templates when necessary. Had the trader adjusted to a semi-instant template, the markets that were impacted would have been removed.

Since this incident on March 30, 2023, we have not seen any related incidents throughout two full MLB seasons. Kambi fully appreciates that its ability to provide services in Pennsylvania is a privilege and from initial licensure in 2018, Kambi has worked collaboratively with full transparency with the PGCB sports wagering staff.

The PGCB staff members responsible for overseeing sports wagering are dedicated, highly-knowledgeable, hardworking professionals and Kambi and the PGCB share the same goal, to provide an error-free product with several operator partners in Pennsylvania. That concludes my remarks and if any questions, I'm happy to answer them. Thank you.

CHAIR: Any questions or comments from

the Board?

MR. DILLON: Yes, Madam Chair.

CHAIR: Commissioner Dillon?

MR. DILLON: So, this - there was two

5 individuals that were involved in this as far as 6 placing the bets.

Correct? Was there - was it - did I read it was two individuals that were -?

MR. DUFFY: So, the truth is, Kambi doesn't have personal information of the customer. So, basically we just see unique IDs. It was two unique IDs, but I believe it was one person from two different kiosks.

ATTORNEY HVIZDA: Correct,

Commissioner Dillon, yes. Alex Hvizda, Director of

Compliance. There was one individual at the property and he was using two different kiosks. And part of the remedial measures here at the property, because we can't see the level of detail that they have, was to retrain our sportsbook staff that if you see someone using multiple kiosks or if they're standing there for a long period of time or have any sort of electronic device with them that's suspicious activity, you need to go investigate. Because a typical kiosk transaction is you walk up, you place

your wagers, you get your ticket and you go. But this individual, having found this vulnerability, was standing there going back and forth trying to get the bets in as quickly as he could because he knew he was pass-posting.

MR. DILLON: And that was my second question. I mean how, how was he able to pick up on this that quickly to realize there was a delay, you know, for him to be able to get a bet in within 10, 15 seconds? I mean that's somebody -?

ATTORNEY HVIZDA: There could have been somebody at the park. We don't know that. But I mean he would have seen - if he had been listening to it or you know, been watching the game and took advantage of that 6 to 40 seconds.

MR. DILLON: Because the even watching on the phone, it's delayed like - you know what I'm saying? So, just crazy that he was able to pick up that there was a delay going on to be able to, you know, pretty much steal.

ATTORNEY HVIZDA: Yes, yes.

MR. DILLON: Okay.

Thank you.

CHAIR: Any other questions or comments? He picked up after he won one. He

realized something was going on. He was quick. So, Kambi, with regard to the trade, I understand that particular trader was moved to another area?

MR. DUFFY: Yeah. They removed from baseball trading altogether. They're primarily based in Manila, this trader specifically. So, yeah, they haven't traded baseball since.

 $$\underline{\text{CHAIR:}}$$  And had they been with Kambi for a while in that position?

MR. DUFFY: I believe they were, but this was - because this was the first day of the MLB season. Yeah, I just don't think their experience was that strong in MLB to give a little bit of background on why they were doing what they were doing.

CHAIR: Uh-huh.

MR. DUFFY: Essentially, we - normally in a best case scenario, we're taking the pitch results straight from a feed provider, like in this case, Betradar. In this specific case, the connection disconnected, which isn't necessarily rare. It happens and traders are prepared to do so. So, yeah, in this case she or he - yeah, they just were late to update the pitch basically.

CHAIR: Okay.

Thank you. And Alex, I think you addressed what has been done on your end too.

ATTORNEY HVIZDA: Correct. And we haven't seen any sort of similar behavior as they haven't seen any either.

MR. DILLON: One other question. So, you guys are prepared for when they go with this electronic pitch count? Like, you guys got things in place that you're going to be able to -?

MR. DUFFY: Sure, yeah. Do you mean the like upcoming robotic ump situation?

MR. DILLON: Yes, yes.

MR. DILLON: Yeah, yeah. So, I mean our baseball traders are really, you know, sharp on baseball, you could say. I mean, when the pitch clock initially got introduced and we had to deal with, you know, would this pitch violation count as a ball on a result of pitch or whatever like that, that was a long conversation. So, they've been preparing for the robotic ump, even though it's not gonna be in this season. It was only in spring training, but yeah, that's all covered.
