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

With seven Board Members present this morning, I'd like to now call today's meeting to order and I would like to note for the record that Commissioner Manzano-Díaz and Commissioner Regan are participating by phone. Sara, can you hear me?

The first petition for the Board today is a joint request from AGS, LLC and Bingo Holdings

I, LLC for approval of change of control. AGS, LLC is licensed by the Board to manufacture slot machines, table games and interactive gaming software. They're an indirect subsidiary of Play AGS, Inc., a publicly-traded company. Bingo Holdings

I, LLC is owned by a group of private equity firms operating under the name of Brightstar Capital.

On May 8th, 2024, Play AGS, Bingo
Holdings I, LLC and Bingo Merger Sub, Inc., entered
into Agreement and Plan of Merger which will result
in Play AGS becoming wholly and directly owned by a
subsidiary of Bingo Holdings I, LLC. The OEC has no
objection to the request for a change in control,
subject to conditions outlined in their Answer,
including the condition that licensure or interim
authorization be granted to all principals behind the
new entity.

Royal Buying Group initially filed their Gaming Service Provider Registration

Application in November of 2016. During their background investigation, the Board's BIE contacted the company on several occasions regarding the submission of fingerprint records needed to complete the required background checks and investigation.

Royal Buying Group failed to comply and consequently the Board placed them on the Prohibited Gaming Service Provider List in July of 2017. Royal Buying Group filed a Petition for Removal from the List and then amended the Petition in March of 2025, informing the Board of changes in their ownership with the new ownership group being committed to complying with all of the requirements necessary to complete the registration process.

Based upon the Petitioner's assertions, the OEC has no objection to the requested relief, subject to conditions in its Answer, and this

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matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

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                   On February 10, 2010, A.N. placed
22
   himself on the List choosing the lifetime Self-
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Exclusion option. On March 14, 2025, A.N. filed a request for removal from the List stating that he would like to attend concerts and dine at licensed facilities with his friends and family and further stated that he understands the consequences of gambling and that one must gamble within their limits.

As required by the Board's regulations, A.N. also provided the required Problem Gambling Assessment Verification Form signed by a certified assessment provider confirming that an assessment of A.N. was performed and that problem gambling treatment was not recommended.

The OEC filed an Answer stating it has no objection to A.N.'s request as it's been over 15 years since his placement on the List and he submitted all the required documentation. OEC acknowledges in its Answer that A.N. had five violations of the self-exclusion. However, most of those violations were over eight years ago and the most recent violation was over four years ago. As such, OEC has no objection to the removal of A.N.

The first Report and Recommendation

before the Board today is Amber Carney. Ms. Carney

holds a Non-Gaming Employee Registration and works as

a beverage bartender at Rivers Casino Pittsburgh. On

December 9, 2024, the OEC filed a complaint for

emergency suspension of Ms. Carney's registration

after receiving notice that she had been charged with

felony and misdemeanor offenses.

As a result of these charges, the Executive Director issued an emergency Order suspending Ms. Carney's registration. A hearing in this matter was held on February 27, 2025. Both OEC and Ms. Carney, along with her counsel appeared for the hearing. The parties stipulated to the admission of the documents that OEC had planned to introduce and therefore no testimony was taken. The documents that the parties stipulated included the criminal complaint, affidavit of probable cause and docket sheets showing that Ms. Carney's five year old child was brought to the hospital for abnormal behavior and suspected seizures, that the child tested positives for the metabolites of cocaine.

A search of Ms. Carney's residence

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showed that there was cocaine residue found in a room containing baby items. Additional tests show that both parents had cocaine and methamphetamine metabolites in their system. Following a hearing, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that the suspension of Ms. Carney's permit remain in effect and this matter is now ripe for the Board's

By way of background, on April 24, 2024, the OEC filed a complaint for emergency suspension of Mr. Deyoc's Non-Gaming Employee Registration after receiving notice that he had been charged with felony offenses. Specifically, it was alleged that Mr. Deyoc, who was subletting a room in his apartment to another individual, was involved in an altercation with the subletter and their guest. The altercation became physical and upon the two individuals attempting to leave, Mr. Deyoc was alleged to have retrieved a firearm and threatened their lives, ordering them to return to their room.

As a result of these charges, the Board's Executive Director issued an emergency Order suspending Mr. Deyoc's registration. A hearing on that matter was held in June 2024 and consequently, in September 2024, the Board issued an Order continuing the suspension of Mr. Deyoc's registration.

On September 23rd, 2024, Mr. Deyoc filed a Petition to lift the suspension of his registration. OEC subsequently filed a complaint seeking the registration (sic) of Mr. Deyoc's registration, however. Additionally, OEC filed an Answer objecting to Mr. Deyoc's request to lift the suspension. A hearing on both of these issues was held on February 4, 2025. OEC appeared offering testimony and documentary evidence.

2.0

Mr. Deyoc appeared and testified on his own behalf. Evidence and testimony of the hearing showed that Mr. Deyoc's criminal charges had been resolved. He had pleaded guilty to two misdemeanor offenses, was ordered not to possess firearms and to stay away from one of the two victims.

During his testimony, Mr. Deyoc admitted to the altercation, but stated that following the incident, he and the parties had engaged in discussion regarding the same. He also disputed the allegations regarding the firearm. He further testified to his education and his work

history, which included his employment with Evolution as a construction project manager. He stated that although he had been terminated from Evolution following the charges, they had offered him employment as a virtual table games dealer. And Mr. Deyoc also testified to his family, community and charity activities.

2.0

After hearing all the evidence presented, a Report and Recommendations issued recommending that Mr. Deyoc's request to lift the emergency suspension of this registration be granted and that OEC's request for revocation be reduced to a lesser sanction. OEC filed exceptions to the recommendation stating that Mr. Deyoc is unsuitable to hold a registration, and this matter is now ripe for the Board's consideration.

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ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: Alex Aguirre is the next Report and Recommendation before the Board.

In April 2024, the OEC filed a Petition to place Mr. Aguirre on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List after being notified that on March 4th, 2024, Mr. Aguirre was participating in Presque Isle Down and Casino's Dealer Training Program, sent threatening text messages to his ex-girlfriend who was also participating in the program and one of the program's instructors.

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A hearing in this matter was held

1 February 2025. Despite receiving proper notice, Mr.

2 Aguirre failed to appear. OEC appeared at the

3 hearing presenting testimony and documentary

4 evidence. Evidence presented at the hearing showed

5 that Mr. Aguirre was charged with and pleaded guilty

6 to two counts of terroristic threats and sentenced to

7 two years' probation for the threatening text

8 messages.

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Additionally, he was permanently evicted from the casino as a result of his actions. Thereafter, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that Mr. Aguirre be placed on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List, and this matter's now ripe for the Board's consideration.

and Recommendation pertaining to Zeming Huang. By way of background, in February 2012, the OEC filed a complaint to place Mr. Huang on the Board's Exclusion List for participating in a scheme to cheat during blackjack at Sugarhouse Casino. Consequently, the Board placed Mr. Huang on the Exclusion List in May of 2012.

Mr. Huang requested early removal from the List in 2013, which was denied by the Board. Mr. Huang is now again requesting removal from the Involuntary Exclusion List. The OEC filed an Answer objecting to Mr. Huang's request, alleging that Mr. Wong failed to provide good cause in his petition as to why he should be removed.

A hearing in this matter was held

February 27, 2025. Despite receiving prior notice,

Mr. Huang failed to attend and it was held in his

absence. Thereafter, a Report and Recommendation was

issued recommending that Mr. Huang's Petition be

denied and he failed to appear for the hearing and

put forth evidence in support of his Petition.

However, it is worth noting that the Hearing Officer during the proceeding, took official notice of the fact that all the facts pled in the Petition were admitted by OEC in their response, including that Mr. Huang had completed the ARD program for the criminal charges stemming from the incident, as well as the fact that he had no violations of the of his exclusion ban in over 12 years. And this matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

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Answer objecting to Mr. Madanat's request and a hearing in this matter was held February 12, 2025.
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Despite receiving proper notice, Mr.

4 Madanat failed to appear. OEC appeared at the

5 hearing and moved to the dismiss the Petition based

6 on Mr. Madanat's absence. Thereafter, a Report

7 Recommendation issued recommending that Mr. Madanat's

8 Petition either be dismissed or denied and this

9 matter's now ready for the Board's consideration.

was found he was cheating while gaming at Parx.

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Patton placed bets totaling \$257 while playing a hand at Texas Hold'em Poker. After the hand was over, Mr. Patton had lost. He had picked up \$257 in wagered chips, left the table, cashed them in and exited the casino. His actions led to theft of the other patron's expected winnings on that hand.

A hearing on the matter was held

February 2019, resulting in Mr. Patton being placed
on the Board's Involuntary Exclusion List. Mr.

Patton has now filed a Petition seeking removal from
the List. OEC filed an Answer objecting the request
and a hearing was held February 13th, 2025.

OEC appeared presenting testimony and documentary evidence. Mr. Patton appeared and testified on his own behalf expressing remorse and

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apologizing for his actions. He further testified
he's been a nurse for approximately 24 years.

Provided character references from his supervisors
attesting his good character, work ethic and good
morals. Mr. Patton further stated that he had gamed
in other states without incident and has complied
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with the Board Order.

Following the hearing, a Report and Recommendation was issued recommending that Mr.

Patton be removed from the Involuntary Exclusion List and this matter is now ready for the Board's consideration.

CHAIR SMYLER: Any questions or comments? May I have a motion, please?

ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: The next Report and Recommendation before the Board today stems from a request for the early removal from the Voluntary Self-Exclusion List by an individual with the initials T.G.

By way of background, T.G. placed himself on the Self-Exclusion List on March 4, 2022, choosing the five-year self-exclusion period. In T.G.'s request for removal from the List, he asserts that he did not place himself on the List, that it was his significant other at the time that signed him up for the exclusion.

The OEC filed an Answer objecting to the request and, thereafter, the Director of the OHA issued a decision and Order denying the request.

T.G. timely appealed the decision and a hearing was

22 held in this matter December 10, 2024. T.G. appeared

and testified on his own behalf. OEC appeared at the hearing presenting testimony and documentary evidence.

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Evidence and testimony presented at the hearing show that in 2021, T.G. initially had submitted an incomplete registration and placed himself on the List, which was ultimately rejected.

Than on March 4th, 2022, T.G. properly filled out and completed the self-exclusion forms, signing and acknowledging that he's a problem gambler, was excluding himself from casinos and gaming-related activities, could not revoke, rescind or withdraw his placement on the List and that he could not be removed from the List until after the expiration of his self-exclusion period.

During the exclusion process, T.G. was required to answer personal questions as part of the verification process and upload a government-issued identification card and a live photograph. T.G.'s ex-girlfriend testified at the hearing that during the relationship he complained on several occasions that he was tired of gambling, that she was familiar

with the exclusion process due to her training and employment at Rivers Casino Philadelphia and that she did provide him with the information about the exclusion program and the process.

2.0

She further stated that she did not assist him in filling out the exclusion forms, but did take the picture for him in 2021 during his first attempt, which was the incomplete registration.

Additionally, his ex-girlfriend stated that the relationship ended in 2021 prior to his successful placement on the List.

T.G. did violate his exclusion on one occasion in March 2023. He testified at the hearing that he received a call from his grandmother to pick her up at the casino as she was being followed and was scared. Upon entry to the casino, he was identified as being on the List and was denied access. He was permanently evicted and charged with defiant trespass, a charge which he was later found not guilty.

The hearing on this matter - after hearing all the evidence, a Report and Recommendation

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was issued recommending that T.G.'s Petition be

ATTORNEY ZIMMERMANN: The final Report and Recommendation before the Board today stems from a request to recover funds confiscated while on the Self-Exclusion List. As the Board is aware, when a self-excluded person is found on a Pennsylvania casino, the act dictates that any winnings possessed by the person can - may - shall be confiscated from him and used to support compulsive and problem gambling.

On October 22nd, 2024, A.R. filed a

Petition requesting recovery of funds confiscated

from him. A hearing in this matter was held February

20th, 2025. The OEC appeared and presented

documentary and testimonial evidence with the

assistance of an interpreter, A.R. appeared and

testified on his own behalf.

Evidence presented at the hearing show that on March 9, 2020, A.R. met with a Board employee at Mohegan Sun Pocono, now Mohegan Pennsylvania. He completed all the necessary self-exclusion paperwork,

choosing the five-year exclusion period and signing all the acknowledgments, which included an acknowledgement that he was prohibited from collecting any winnings, money or thing of value from gaming activity while on the List.

2.0

On October 18, 2024, A.R. was gaming at Mount Airy for approximately three hours. He purchased chips several times during those hours for a total of \$1,240. When he went to the cage to cash out, he was identified as a self-excluded individual and \$3,550 in gaming chips were confiscated from him. A.R. had wagered and lost significantly more than his \$1,240 buy-in amount based on the evidence presented by OEC and his winnings therefore exceeded his losses.

A.R. testified that he had made a mistake and apologized, but he stated he did not know he was banned from all Pennsylvania casinos. He believed he was only excluded from Mohegan Sun Pocono where he had completed the self-exclusion process.

Testimony also showed that on February 4, 2022, A.R. had entered Mohegan, was cited and pleaded guilty to

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trespassing. After hearing all the evidence
